





**The Weight of Blood, L McHugh**






### Die for You, Lisa Unger


### The Good Girl, Mary Kubica


### Defending Jacob, William Landay


### The Passenger, Lisa Lutz


### The Kind Worth Killing, Peter Swanson


### Before I Go to Sleep, SJ Watson


### Luckiest Girl Alive, J Knoll


### What She Knew, Gilly MacMillan
