# MILLBURN FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY ANNUAL REPORT – YEAR 2023



#### **Visitation**

Visitation is returning to pre-pandemic levels. In 2023 there were 183,214 recorded visits to the library. This is an increase of 69.1% over the previous year.

The library tracks visitation through counting devices installed at the library entrances. At this point, we are only slightly behind visitation for year 2014. Of note: the library's average attendance for all years from 2013 – 2023 was 176,489, so visitation for 2023 was above average. Moreover, trends in visitation for 2023 closely follow the patterns of all pre-pandemic years, further suggesting a return to normal.



#### **Circulation**

Circulation is the count of all items that the library lends out. It includes books, magazines, e-books, audio books, DVDs, museum passes, and any other items that are available for borrowing, including museum passes and objects from our growing "library of things." The library of things includes a microscope, bocce and pickleball, a telescope, power tools, a blood pressure cuff, and 18 other things.


2023 was the MFPL's best year ever for circulation. For the year, 418,549 item checkouts were recorded. This is the first time the library ever exceeded the 400,000 mark. This is particularly remarkable because only two years ago the library crossed the 300k mark for the first time. Our one-year growth was 30% and our two-year growth was nearly 40%. The MFPL is now in the very rare realm of 20 circs per capita, making the Millburn Library one of the best used libraries in New Jersey. The MFPL was also the #5 library in all of BCCLS and the MFPL's Children's Room ranked #1 in the consortium for most checkouts.



The Millburn Liibrary offered the most programming ever in year 2023, continuing a decade-long pattern of growth. Notice that the number of adult programs alone in 2023 is greater than the total number of programs for all age groups offered in 2019.

In 2023, the library held 972 programs with 23,414 participants. This is a 44% increase in the number of programs and a 39% increase in participation.

The previous record, which was set in 2022, was 673 programs with 16,800 attendees.

A good portion of this increase is attributed to the library's flourishing English Language Learning program, which debuted in 2022 (see more below).

## Strategic Plan

In early 2023, the library hosted four community focus groups and ran a month-long community survey to get feedback about the library. That information was distilled into the library's new 4-year strategic plan covering the years 2023-2026. The goals of the plan are: 1) Refresh the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and exterior of the facility; 2) Improve marketing; 3) Enhance user experiences; 4) Improve multicultural programming; and 5) Cultivate a network of "Library Champions." The strategic plan is on the library website and available in-print at the library.

#### **Major Gift**

In 2022, the Millburn Library learned that it was a beneficiary in Stetson Mead Baker's will, a lifelong resident of Short Hills. In January 2023, the library received \$2,088,607.91 from the estate. The residual is expected to be paid in early 2024. Funds are on deposit and will be used to cover capital projects as well as fund long-range library services.

It should be noted that gifts, donations, bequests, and grants are exempt from the Return of Funds Law (N.J.S.A. 40:54-15).

#### **Capital Improvements**

The library is now planning a renovation of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor meeting rooms, restrooms, hallways and administrative offices. The layout and functions will be primarily the same, but with 21<sup>st</sup> century improvements, such as more efficient lighting, increased electrical capacity, and aesthetic changes that will harmonize with the renovations completed on the first floor in 2021-2022.

#### **Collection Development**

The Millburn Library's physical collection of books, DVDs and other materials now stands at 77,032 items. In 2023, the library added just over 7,300 new titles to its holdings, including 6,800 books and 480 DVDs and audiobooks. The library also added hundreds of e-book titles in addition to the hundreds of thousands of items already available through our electronic and streaming services. Of special note, the MFPL now has a "Library of Things" that includes a telescope, ukuleles, 3-D doodle pens, Amazon Fire tablets, Wi-Fi hotspots, bocce, and more.

#### English Language Learning

The Millburn Library restructured staff in 2022 and allocated one part-time librarian position to ELL activities. The library now boasts one of the premier English Language Learning programs in the area,

has an excellent collection of world language materials, subscribes to ESL materials including easy English periodicals, offers citizenship programs, and hosts conversation groups for people at all levels of English language acquisition. Of special note: the most popular language learned in our Mango Languages subscription is now English.
